Percent of children (0-5 years) with excellent or very good oral health.

Early Prenatal Care

Number and percent of live births to women receiving early (1st trimester) prenatal care.

Smoking During Pregnancy

(a) Percent of women smoking three months before pregnancy

(b) Percent of women smoking during last three months of pregnancy

(c) Percent of women smoking after pregnancy

Alcohol Consumption during Pregnancy

(a) Percent of women consuming alcohol during the three months before pregnancy.

(b) Percent of women consuming alcohol during the last three months of pregnancy

Domestic Violence

(a) Percent of women experiencing abuse before pregnancy

(b) Percent of women experiencing abuse during pregnancy

Unintended Pregnancy Rates

Percent or number of women who reported their pregnancy was unintended or mistimed.

Type of health insurance coverage, if any, a child had at time of survey

Medical Home Status of Children 0-5 years

Percent of children who receive health care meeting the American Academy of Pediatrics' definition of medical home

Socio-economic Difficulties

Percent of children (3-5 years) identified with moderate or severe difficulties in at least one of the following areas: emotions, concentration, behavior, or ability to get along with other people.

Maternal Mental Health Status

Percent of children (0-5 years) who's mother's mental and emotional health is excellent or very good.

Paternal Mental Health Status

Percent of children (0-5 years) who's father's mental and emotional health is excellent or very good. This was only asked when the father was identified as participating in the child's upbringing.

Weight status of children (< 2 years of age)

Prevalence of overweight in children less than two years of age, enrolled in WIC program.

Overweight is defined by 2000 CDC growth chart percentiles for weight-for-length

Weight status of children (2-5 years)

Prevalence of overweight in children aged less than 5 years old, enrolled in WIC program.

Overweight is defined by BMI for age and gender greater than or equal to the 95th percentile, according to 2000 CDC BMI-for-age tables.

Children with Special health Care Needs (CSHCN)

Prevalence of children 0 to 5 years of age that have special health care needs.

Lead Screening by Age

Percent of children born in 2001 who received at least one blood lead screen by the age of 24 months.

Incidence of Lead Poisoning

Incidence of children 0-5 years of age with elevated blood lead levels of 10 mcg/dL or greater

Infant Mortality Rates – 0-12 Months

Number of deaths to infants under one year of age, 2001-2003.

Infant Mortality Rates – 1-4 Years

Number of deaths to children 1-4 years of age, 2001-2003

Immunization

Percent of 19 to 35 month-old children who received a full schedule of age-appropriate immunizations against measles, mumps, rubella, polio, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, Haemophilus influenza, hepatitis B, and varicella vaccine

Well-child and Preventive Health Visits, 0-15 months

Percent of children enrolled in managed care plans who had five or more well-child and preventive health care visits in their first 15 months of live, in:

(a) Commercial health insurance plans

(b) Medicaid

(c) Child Health Plus

Well-child and Preventive Health Visits, 3-6 years

Family Structure and Children's Living Arrangements

Number and percent of children 5 and under by family type:

a) Married-couple families

Foster Care

Number/percent of children aged 5 and under in foster care

Child Care Subsidies

Number of children/families receiving child care subsidies (0-5 yrs.)

Child Abuse and Maltreatment

Number / percent of Child Protective Services indicated cases with abused or maltreated children  
whose age at intake was 5 or younger.

Grandparents as primary caregiver

Number/percent of grandparents living with and responsible for care of own grandchildren.

Early Care Services

Number of children enrolled in:

(a) Child care (children aged 0-5 enrolled in day care center, family day care, group family care, or small day care centers)

Household English Proficiency

Number and percent of population 5 years and older who speak a language other than English at home, and speak English less than “very well”.

Linguistically Isolated Households

Number and percent of population 5 years and older who live in linguistically isolated households.

(A linguistically isolated household is one in which no member over 14 years of age (a) speaks only English, or (b) speaks a non-English language and speaks English “very well”. In other words, all members 14 years of age or older have at least some difficulty with English.)

Public and non-public school enrollment by grade level

(a) Number and percent of children 3 and over enrolled in nursery school or preschool

(b) Number and percent of children 3 and over enrolled in kindergarten

Preschool Special Education Program

Number of children aged 3-5 years enrolled in preschool special education

Reading to Young Children

Percent of children 0-5 years who are read to every day.

Parent’s Concerns

Percent of children aged 0-5 whose parents have at least one concern about their child’s learning, development, behavior, or getting along with others.

Community and Neighborhood Safety

Percent of parents with children 0-5 years who feel that their child is usually or always safe in their community or neighborhood.

Supportive Neighborhoods

Percent of children or youth 0-5 years who live in supportive neighborhoods

Firearm-related Index Case

Number and rate per 1,000 persons in general population of firearm-related index crimes

Property Index Crimes

Number and rate of burglary, larceny and motor vehicle thefts per 1,000 persons in the general populations

Violent Index Crimes

Number and rate of murders, non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault, per 1,000 persons in the general populations
